FVFNT WRAP-UP

Esperance Glory for Feeney and Rogowska

Sydney's Adam Feeney and Victoria's Olivia Rogowska are the 2012 Cliffs Esperance Tennis International champions after winning the men's and women's singles finals on Sunday in Western Australia.

27-year-old Feeney won his first singles Futures title since 2007 when he defeated South Australia's Alex Bolt (Murray Bridge, SA) in the men's event, 3-6 7-6(2) 6-2. Feeney has had some solid results on the Australian Pro Tour in recent weeks, reaching the finals of Happy Valley and Port Pirie and on Sunday broke through to prevail over Bolt for the first time. "It's been a long time coming," said Feeney post match.



"It was really tough windy conditions. Alex was playing well at the start and was playing a bit better than I was, but I found a bit more rhythm on my serve early in the second set and got a break up 5-3. Alex got the break back but I played a pretty solid tiebreak and was able to run away with it and keep the momentum into the third.

"I feel like all the work I've been able to do with my coach is shining through over the last couple of weeks. I still feel really fresh, my body is going well at the moment.

"I'm just looking forward to playing every day. I'm enjoying it so much," continued Feeney.

Bolt experienced victory in the men's doubles event when he partnered with AIS Pro Tour colleague Benjamin Mitchell (Worongary, Qld). The pair defeated Feeney and Zach Itzstein(Champion Lakes, WA) 6-2 6-3 to take away Mitchell's first ever doubles title.

Rogowska claimed her third Pro Tour title for the year, defeating 16-year-old Ashleigh Barty (Springfield, Qld) 6-0 6-3 in the women's competition.

The top seed was happy to walk away with her first win against [5] Barty, after the Queenslander led the head-to-head count 2-0 going into the final.

"I played really well, so I was really happy," said Rogowska.

"It was so windy. I don't think I've ever played in conditions like that. I knew what to expect today and was ready from the first point so I was pleased.

"My own focus was to get one extra ball back and just make her play one extra shot. I thought I played smart in the wind, and on the big points I played solid, so that helped me," added Rogowska.



In the women's doubles event, Barty teamed up with Sally Peers (Glen Waverley, Vic) to win their second title together since Nottingham in June. The top seeded pair defeated Rogowska and Victoria Larriere from France in a tight match 4-6 7-6(5) [10-4].

The tour now moves south west for the Margaret River Tennis International proudly supported by the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River to round out the Western Australian swing of the circuit.

International stars claim Margaret River titles

New Zealander Michael Venus and France's Victoria Larriere have both defeated seeded players to take out the 2012 Margaret River International proudly supported by the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River on Sunday.

Venus overcame sixth seed Adam Feeney (Gosford, NSW) to take out the men's singles final 6-3 3-6 6-3

The three set win over the highly-fancied Feeney, who had taken out the 2012 Esperance Tennis International one week prior, is Venus' best result for the year.

Meanwhile in the women's event, Frenchwoman Larriere pulled off a surprising win over top seed and Esperance women's singles winner, Olivia Rogowska (St Kilda, Vic) finishing 6-3 6-3. Australian pairing and the number one seeds Luke Saville (Barmera, SA) and Andrew Whittington (Williamstown, Vic) took out the men's doubles event over second seeds Matthew Barton (Manly, NSW) and Michael Look (Scarborough, Old) in a close match 7-6(6) 7-6(4).

The women's doubles saw the unseeded Japanese pair of Miyabi Inoue and Mai Minokoshi defeat the number one seeds of Nicha Lertpitaksinchai (THA) and Peangtarn Plipuech (THA) 6-7(8) 7-6(3) [14-12] in another close doubles match.

National Academy Manager - Andrew Roberts recently travelled with five athletes from the National Academy - Perth to compete in two Junior International ITF Tournaments at Sydney Olympic Park in Homebush, NSW.

Anja Dokic and Sasha Bollweg were standout performers over the two weeks with Bollweg making a Quarterfinal appearance during the second event. Anja Dokic had consistent results throughout the two weeks making the singles Quarterfinals in both tournaments, a doubles final with Katerina

Valos and finishing the tour by winning a doubles title with her partner Zoe Hives.

Madison Inglis also continued her recent form from the recent 14's Nationals by reaching the round of 16 in the singles and the doubles Semifinal with her Partner Kimberley Birrell.

National Academy National Head Coach - Adam Carey had this to say:

"Our players had solid results reflect the hard work and continued development of this group.

Dokic and Bollweg have both worked hard to develop themselves this year. It's good to see its showing on the court in their performances". "All the players will use these valuable weeks on the road to refocus their training for the December Showdown".

We also had three athletes who performed well at the recent 14's Nationals in Sydney. Maddison Inglis made the Semi-Finals of the girl's singles and won the doubles title with her partner – Kimberley Birrell. Scott Jones made the Semi-Finals of the boy's singles and Sasha Bollweg made the Quarter-Finals of the girl's singles.

They run alongside the Optus Junior Tour (OJT) events which offer Australian Ranking (AR) points, as a "play tennis" pathway. The underlying principles are a healthy attitude and fair play while competing to the best of your ability, and encouraging participation.

The Spring Series comprised a stand-alone series of 6 events, each held over a weekend, which has become particularly popular. The final event was held on the weekend of the 27th and 28th October at the State Tennis Centre. To wind-up the series, an invitational final will be held on the second weekend of December, for all winners of each age group over the series. These include Declan Mearns, Matias Basur, Luka Brown, Arden De Melo, Ryan McConkey and Jerome Iaconi in the 11's. Talia Gibson, Samanthe Yeats, and Ruby Culley were multiple winners in the girls 11's. The boys 13's winners were William Hann, Dennis Mader, Narayan Judge, Reuben Giorgio and Ronan Swingler, while the girls were Lexie Wier, Maddison Barrett, Hailee Katsamakis and Rachel Mellor. In the 15's boys, Timothy Gray, Lewis May, Simon Ferreira and Andrew May were victorious.

2012 Bruce Cup

Alexander Park Tennis Club was honoured to host the 2012 School Sport Australia National 12 and under Bruce cup tournament in October, the first time it has been held in WA.

112 boys and girls representing their states and territories competed in singles, doubles and mixed doubles over seven days with New South Wales winning the cup from South Australia. Western Australia finished fifth.

The tournament was a resounding success with visiting players, their parents and team managers very generous in their comments about the facilities, excellent grass courts and the overall management of the event.

The opening ceremony was held at sunset on the Saturday evening prior to the start of matches. It was a spectacular occasion with players and managers from all teams assembling behind their state flags, the recital of the School Sport Australia Student Pledge by the WA captains Erica Bolweg and Tristan Schoolkate and the singing of the National Anthem by Emily Janes. This was followed by a sausage sizzle for players and it gave them the opportunity to mingle and get to know each other.

A visit by Alicia Molik was a special treat for the players. Alicia recounted her memories of participating in the Bruce Cup and spoke about her career in the game.



COMPETITIONS CHATTER

The Summer Brikmakers Tennis West Tennis League is now under way. It remains the largest tennis league association in Australia, with summer team numbers showing good growth from 840 last year to 884 this season. This renewed interest illustrates Tennis West's strategy to stay in touch with stakeholders and deliver appropriate competition. The largest expansion was in the Saturday Men's Open sector, now comprising 19 Divisions and 150 teams. At this rate we will have to start Sunday divisions. Night league continues to become more popular with 83 Women's teams and 34 Men's teams taking part. The recently introduced Orange and Green Ball leagues for 9 to 11 year olds have been a great success, swelling to 65



teams. This is intended as a pathway for Hot Shot participants and has not yet reached maturity. Watch this space as Tennis West strives to present tennis players with more opportunities to play at all levels and also engage new participants! Let's grow our sport and our clubs!

Last summer the National Tennis League generated much interest for tennis in WA. Our best players

competed in the spotlight and the winning teams travelled to the Australian Open to pit themselves against other state conferences. This is intended as a development opportunity for our elite players for which they are well rewarded. It also showcases our sport at the highest level. The WA conference commission will continue to offer this spectacle over the 4 Wednesday evenings in November with web movies, press and social media publications. Each conference will also nominate an All-Conference Team who will then form the nominees for an All-Australian team selected on performance, team spirit and sportsmanship, to be presented and awarded at the AO.

Next Wednesday, 7th November, from 7pm, the Asia-Pacific Tennis League hits off with the Giants playing the Dolphins and the Mosquitoes taking on the Sharks in the Men's event. The Giants sister team play the Blue Gum Park Ball Bursters and the Mad Dogs meet the Swans in the Women's event. It is played in a fast tennis format with sets to the best of 4, and play will be continuous after let serves. Come and join in the excitement and the State Tennis Centre.
