Cathy Garbin will present on the use of supplemental nursing systems, providing an overview of the indications for use, timing of introduction, and practical aspects. This is a hands-on workshop that will enable participants to observe and practice the setting up, placement and management of the nursing system.

Alex will discuss the published literature with regard to maternal diet and the fat composition of human milk, described challenges in assessing maternal diet and measuring milk fat. Alex will also update us on her current longitudinal research project that examines maternal diet and milk composition of exclusively breastfeeding mothers across the first 6 months and beyond.
