ENROLMENTS

Places are limited, and our policy is to enrol our existing students first. However we maintain a waiting list, which is consulted as soon a vacancy occurs, and we attempt to be scrupulously fair in allocation of places. With planned refurbishment in the office, there is further pressure on the number of students that we can accommodate this year. We may not be able to meet the requirements of students with special needs. You can either come in to the Reception Office to enrol during school hours or you can enrol through the mail. (1st Floor, Trinity Building, via the lift or stairs) School hours are: 9am to 3pm in term time.
